Dear Parent,

On Tuesday we celebrated our Opening of the School Year Mass with Father Peter. Thank you to Father Peter and Kriss Oliver our Religious Education Leader for organising the mass.

It was wonderful to see our new Foundation students attend their first school mass for the year. Many thanks to the parents and friends who came to join us. We hope parents can also join us at the Ash Wednesday Mass on Wednesday the 26th of February at 9.00am.

This week we have a stunningly beautiful display of bright pink flowers from our crepe myrtle tree near the front gate of the school. It was a reminder of the beauty of God's world which surrounds us everyday.

This year is a Review year for Our Lady's School. Schools are reviewed every 4 years and are asked report on the impact they have made in the following areas of schooling: Religious Education, Leadership and Management, Learning and Teaching, Wellbeing and Community.

We have set aside 2 days next week: Tuesday the 18th and Wednesday the 19th of February to work through an extensive process involving deep analysis and reflection of the last 4 years of data (2016-2019). We will also begin to formulate goals and targets for the next four years as well as write our 2020 school review report. I apologise if this has caused any difficulties for parents but I do not choose the date for the review it is given to me. My responsibility is to make sure that we meet all compliance requirements as set out by the VRQA.

The school reviewer will be visiting Our Lady's school in the first and second week of Term 2. While the reviewer is at the school she will speak to the students and staff as well as a parent group about the school. I will continue to keep you informed about this process.

ROLE DESCRIPTIONS OF THE PARENTS AND FRIENDS COMMITTEE

President

The President's position carries a task of trust and responsibility and requires skill and time. The President should exercise authority with tact, be impartial and open to other points of view.

The main role of the President is to:

- ★ Be the main representative/spokesperson for the P&F
- Liaise with the Committee members and set the agenda for meetings
- ★ Be the main contact for agenda items
- ★ Open the meetings punctually and ensure the agenda is followed
- Ensure those present at the meeting have the opportunity to discuss each item on the agenda prior to a decision being made
- * Make sure, particularly on contentious matters, as many points of view as possible are expressed
- Make sure everyone is given an opportunity to speak and encourage members to speak by addressing questions to them
- * Work towards a collaborative approach with other members of school community
- * Be mindful of timelines, keep discussions on track and keep meetings moving
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Vice-President

The Vice President plays an important role by assisting the President with P&F responsibilities and replacing the President and chair meetings in the absence of the President.

Secretary

The Secretary is very important to the efficient operation of the P&F. Duties and responsibilities include:

- ★ Taking minutes at P&F and Committee meetings
- ★ Photocopying and distributing minutes to Committee members along with agenda prior to the next meeting
- In consultation with the Principal and President:
- Providing a summary of the matters discussed at the meeting for display on the parents' notice board
- ★ Dealing with any incoming/outgoing correspondence

Treasurer

The Treasurer carries a task of trust and responsibility. Duties and responsibilities include:

- Keeping accurate financial records of all receipts and expenditure

STUDENT MOBILE PHONE UPDATE

Our Lady's Primary School takes the safe and responsible use of digital technologies seriously. The school acknowledges that we live in a technology-rich world where mobile phones are an important communication tool. Research has found that mobile phones and other devices can be disruptive in classrooms and open to misuse at school. We have defined Mobile Phone to be a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. (DET 2020). When we refer to mobile phones this includes any device that may connect to or has a similar function to a mobile phone such as smart watches.

The unregulated presence of mobile phones and other devices in classrooms can undermine students' capacity to think, learn, remember, pay attention and regulate emotion. This is why there are no mobile phones or smart watches allowed in classrooms or on the playground.

Our Lady's Primary School has developed a policy and associated procedure to provide staff members, students, parents and carers with clear guidelines on mobile phone restrictions, exemptions and storage requirements at school. You will be able to access this policy on the school website in the following week.

This policy takes effect at the commencement of the 2020 school year and complies with the direction of the Victorian Minister for Education under <u>Section 5.2.1(2)(b) of the Education and Training Reform Act 2006</u>. You will be able to access the whole policy

Our Lady's Primary School discourages students bringing personal mobile phones to school. It does; however, acknowledge that some students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

Mobile phones are not permitted for use at Our Lady's Primary School during school hours:

Students who bring a personal mobile phone to school must switch them off and leave them at the Administration Office prior to the commencement of the school day and may only collect them from the Office at the conclusion of the school day or if they are required to leave school early.

SUNSMART

A reminder that all students should be wearing the Our Lady's school hats while in the playground. If any child does not have they will be asked to sit in the shade, we will be enforcing the 'No hat, no play' rule.

Please ensure your child/children do not wear:

- Rings
- Earrings other than sleepers or studs
- Make-up
- Bandanas
- Bracelets or bangles
- Necklaces/bracelets other than a simple chain with a cross or item of religious significance
- Items of clothing that have not been purchased from the school's uniform shop
- Sports shoes on non-sport days
- Black runners instead of black leather shoes

The power of gratitude for a happier life

More than just a nice feeling, gratitude is integral to happiness. If we can inspire and cultivate gratitude in our children, we're doing so much more than teaching them to be polite by saying 'thank-you'. We're helping them develop a strength that will positively affect their mental health and wellbeing over a lifetime. It's that powerful.

Remember how many times you had to remind your kids to use their manners all those years ago? I know, probably too many! Still reminding? You're not alone! In the same way good manners eventually become a part of daily life, sincere gratitude will too. It's worth persevering.

Benefits of a grateful mindset

The science tells us that compared with those who don't, people who practice gratitude are more enthusiastic, more determined, perform better at school, are more likely to avoid risky behaviours, experience less depression and envy, are more kind and helpful, sleep better and are 25 per cent happier.

Adolescents with a grateful mindset are more optimistic and experience greater social support, which is essential to their health and happiness. They experience more fulfilling friendships and family relationships, are more content in themselves and with their school, have higher grades and are less focused on material possessions.

There's simply no down side!

Practicing gratitude is a sure-fire way to boost happiness, something we absolutely want for ourselves and for our children. In addition, teaching our children genuine appreciation helps them develop strong relationships over the course of their lives, and we know that strong relationships are critical to our overall happiness.

Gratitude isn't just good for the giver either. It's wonderful for the recipient too. Do you remember how you felt the last time sincere gratitude was expressed to you? It lifts our spirits, boosts our mood and inevitably strengthens our relationship with the person expressing their thanks.

Where do I start?

The best way to teach gratitude is for us as parents to role model it. When you're feeling grateful, tell your kids and explain why. If you do something kind for someone to thank them for helping you, share your story over the evening meal. Like all values we want for our kids to embrace, it's 'monkey see, monkey do'.

Different families teach gratitude in different ways. The trick is to introduce a gratitude practice that doesn't feel like a chore. Even if there's a little resistance at first, don't give up. It feels good to be grateful, so it should eventually become something that doesn't need too much of a nudge.

Supporting your child to become more grateful begins with teaching three fundamental ideas:

- 1. Awareness that someone has purposefully done something to benefit them.
- 2. Awareness that taking action to provide you a benefit cost that person in some way.
- 3. Understanding that the benefit of that person's actions is valuable to them.

There are loads of fun ways to practice gratitude. Here are a few to get you started:

- Regularly express sincere gratitude to your partner and to your children, explaining why.
- Prompt your kids to note things they're grateful for in colourful textas on poster paper on the fridge.
- Paint a wall in chalk paint for your family to artistically (or not!) express their gratitude using chalk.
- Ask each family member what they're thankful for each evening at dinner.
- Stop to savour and appreciate the little things like a beautiful flower or a colourful sunset.
- Find the silver lining in difficult circumstances.
- Relive happy moments together.
- Hold hands at the dinner table and thank the person who prepared the food.
- Ask the kids to take photos of the things they're grateful for.
- Keep thank-you notes at the ready and let the kids know when you write one and why. Encourage them to do the same.
- Encourage a contribution from your kids' pocket money towards something they want.
- Start a gratitude journal and invite the kids to make contributions.
- Encourage your kids to help others.
- Help your kids reflect on what they're grateful for, last thing at night.
- Start a gratitude jar and each weekend spend time reading over the notes within.

It's really about finding the right fit for your family. You may need to try a few different ideas. You don't even have to do it everyday, even just a few times a week works well, though it is good to get into a routine with it.

Lastly, Associate Professor Jeffrey Froh, a leading authority on gratitude in young people, tells us that "the deepest sense of gratitude in life comes from connecting to a bigger picture, to an issue that matters to others, and doing things that contribute to society down the road."



Knowing this we can also be on the lookout for opportunities to fan the flames of our childrens' passions and yearnings to make a difference in the lives of others. Step-by-step, day-by-day, we can raise grateful young people who are happier because of their perspective, and who lead rich and fulfilling lives because of what they do for others.
