All our students are spending some time reflecting on their learning throughout Semester One as they prepare for their Three Way Conversations with their teachers. Thank-you to all our staff for supporting their students for this important preparation. Reflecting on our strengths also helps us identify our challenges and set future learning goals.



The Three Way Learning Conversations will commence on Thursday and conclude on Friday. We welcome you as our parents into these very special conversations.

Just a few important reminders about the Three Way Learning Conversations:

- Please ensure you arrive on time so that all appointments can be on time
- All conversations will be held in your child's classroom
- Please enter and exit through the main gate on Station Place near the office, as all other gates will be locked to
  ensure school safety.

Please remember, as parents, you are your child's first teachers, and we strongly value our working partnership. You are always welcome to make an appointment with your child's teacher, just as our teachers quite often reach out to make appointments with parents throughout the year. This is always important to ensure our partnership stays strong as our children are kept at the centre.



In the past newsletters I have written about the School Review Process. This week the first component of our 2025 review commenced. Our 'Victorian Registration & Qualifications Authority' (VRQA) desktop review started, meaning our assigned VRQA reviewer gains desktop access externally to explore our MACS policies and school documentation to ensure compliance. The reviewer will be at our school for a day in the first week of Term 3. The second component of our school review is going very well due to the work of all staff during our closure days in Week 5 and the work of our leadership team. Over the past few weeks, we have been working on finalising all the evidence the school has to submit so that it is concise and ready to submit to our School Improvement Reviewer. We are almost there and I sincerely



thank all staff and the leadership team for their work and support during this essential process.

The school review process is always a lot of work but also a very exciting time as we set our new goals for our school for the next four years.

Some of you may be wondering about our old junior classrooms. A few weeks ago, I updated our Parent Advisory Board on the process and the Commonwealth Funding application Ms Bertani submitted last term. After speaking to one of the managing directors in the MACS Infrastructure and Planning team, I was told a very similar message as they have told Ms Bertani in the past.

Our school is listed as a top priority with the MACS infrastructure team regarding the adapted Stage 2 version of our Master Plan. This would include demolishing the old junior building and creating a new oval space, a senior playground and sports shed. In previous submissions, we would have been 1 in 80, whereas the revised VCEA process now includes us as 1 application in 20. Currently, the assessment process sits with Victoria Catholic Education Authority (VCEA) and conversations based on the applications will commence very soon, if they haven't already. It is a very lengthy process and hopefully we will have an update in the coming months. Of course we will keep you updated when we know more!



### Reading your child's report

Reports can mean anxious times for children. Will my parents be disappointed or proud? This is the main concern of most children.

Could try harder . . . always does her best . . . lacks concentration . . . easily distracted . . . a pleasure to teach . . .

Do these comments, taken from a batch of student reports sound familiar? Student reports bring mixed feelings for parents. Pleasure and pride if they are performing well but considerable angst when children are not progressing as you hoped.

Reports can mean anxious times for children too. Will my parents be disappointed or proud? This is the main concern of most children. Kids of all ages take their cues from their parents, so your reaction to their school report can affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people.

Before you rip open the sealed envelope containing the report do a little self-check to see if you are in the right frame of mind:

#### 1. Are your expectations for your son or daughter realistic and in line with their ability?

Expectations are tricky. If they are too high then kids can be turned off learning. Too low and there is nothing to strive for. Pitch your expectations in line with your child's abilities. A quick check of your child's last report cards may provide you with a good yardstick.

### 2. Do you believe that children learn at different rates?

There are slow bloomers, late developers and steady-as-you-go kids in every classroom, so avoid comparing your child to siblings, your friends' children and even yourself when you were a child. Instead look for individual progress.

#### 3. Are you willing to safeguard your child's self-esteem rather than deflate it?

Self-confidence is a pre-requisite for learning, so be prepared to be as positive and encouraging as possible.

School reports come in different formats. Some are prescriptive while some use grading systems such as A, B, C, etc. with room for teacher comments. Regardless of the format school reports should provide you with an idea of your child's progress in all subject areas, their attitude and social development.

### parenting \*ideas

#### Here are some ideas to consider when you open your child's report:

- Focus on strengths. Do you look for strengths or weaknesses first? The challenge is to focus on strengths
  even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core subjects.
- Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort is below standard, then you have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, then you cannot ask any more than that, regardless of the grading.
- Broaden your focus away from academic performance to form a picture of your child's progress as a
  member of a social setting. How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence his happiness and
  well-being, as well as give an indicator to his future. The skills of independence and co-operation are highly
  valued by employers so don't dismiss these as unimportant.
- Take note of student self- assessment. Kids are generally very honest and will give a realistic assessment of their progress. They are generally very perceptive so take note of their opinions.
- Discuss the report with your son or daughter talking about strengths
  first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask for their opinion
  about how they performed and discuss their concerns.



After reports are read and discussed celebrate your child's efforts with a special activity or treat. In this way you will recognise progress and remind them that the holidays are just around the corner when they can forget about assessment, tests and reports for a while.
