On Monday the staff attended a professional learning day with Kath Murdoch. We worked to deepen our understanding about Personalising Learning using Inquiry Approach. By the end of the day the staff had worked out a whole school plan to implement in 2017 focused on Personalising the Learning using the Inquiry Approach.

Here is a quote from Kath Murdoch's latest book 'The Power of Inquiry' which describes the nature of an inquiry classroom:

'Quality inquiry classrooms are places where highly intentional teachers work hard to grow the capacity of all students to learn. These teachers work diligently to help students know what to do when they don't know, to develop deeper understandings of how the world works and to build and refine a set of skills or dispositions that will enable learning to continue life-long and life-wide.'

Our whole school scripture Matthew 25:40 will be integrated into our Faith-Life-Inquiry learning throughout the term.

Local Council has reminded us that NO PARKING is available on the reserve or alongside the kerb in Victoria or Robinson Streets (circled above).

Cautions have been given to vehicles parked there earlier this week, but from today fines will be issued to any cars parking on the reserve or by the kerb in Victoria or Robinson Streets.

REMINDER: Both roads are two way streets, so parking is NOT PERMITTED AT ANY TIME around the reserve (circled above).

Rail works have stopped services between Sunbury and Sunshine until the end of October, so many commuters are choosing to drive to Sunshine Station and therefore park in our surrounding streets. Please be aware that there has been an increase in car traffic in Sunshine, so you may need to allow extra time at drop off and pick up times, as well as anticipating that you may not be able to find a car park close to School.

Bookings and Cancellations:


