At Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception Parish Primary School we promote the safety, well being and inclusion of all children.

School Uniform

For the first two weeks of this term students can still choose to wear their Summer uniform as we are transitioning into the cooler weather. The children will be expected to be wearing their school winter uniforms from Monday 9th of May onwards.

If you are considering a new coat for your child this Winter, please remember that it is our preference to have either plain navy blue or black. Navy coats with warm polar fleece lining are available at the Uniform Shop or via the QKR App and can be worn when children are outside only. They are not to be worn instead of the jumper, or in the classroom. We do not allow the children to wear hoodies to school, nor do we allow logos that advertise brands. The children should be wearing black leather shoes as a part of their uniform and runners only on the day that they have sport. Cargo pants are not part of our uniform.

No jewellery other than small studs or sleepers or a simple necklace with a religious medallion or cross should be worn

No leggings should be worn, girls should be wearing navy tights only under their tunics. These are sold for your convenience in our uniform shop which is a not for profit service that the school provides to parents.

Parents, please make sure that you purchase the correct Our Lady's school uniform as I have noticed that there are many variations being worn and our school is beginning to look untidy as a result. A uniform reflects the pride we have in our school and is an important part of our school identity. We want to project pride in our school by making sure that all children are wearing the correct school uniform. I ask all parents to support the school in this endeavour. Please feel free to come and discuss with me any issues you may have in regards to the school uniform. I am always happy to discuss these with you.

COVID update

While still recommended, face masks are not required in any school setting. This means students in Grades 3 to 6 and staff and visitors to primary schools are no longer required to wear face masks.

Household contacts of a positive case attending school who are over 8 years of age are required to wear face masks indoors unless they have a valid exemption.

Free rapid antigen tests will continue to be made available for all staff and students in the first 4 weeks of Term 2 2022. Rapid antigen testing will be voluntary for all primary, secondary and specialist school staff and students. It is highly recommended that primary school students and staff test twice weekly during school days.

Household contacts are no longer required to quarantine as long as they take additional safety measures such as informing the school, wearing a mask if over 8 years old, using the Rapid Antigen tests and checking for symptoms. If your child tests positive to COVID you are required to inform the school and quarantine your child for 7 days at home.



Why validation is the best parenting skill of all



At a time when the mental health and wellbeing of children and teenagers is firmly in the spotlight, validation is an essential parenting skill.

When a child or teen comes to you when they are struggling emotionally, they want you to understand their dilemma. They don't want to be dismissed or told to 'get over it'. They generally want someone to acknowledge that their concern is real with comments such as:

"I see you're worried about going to camp. I can understand that." "Thanks for telling about the scary monsters in your bedroom. Let's see what we can do about them." "I'd be afraid too if I was left alone on my own for that long."

Validation of a child's struggles helps them

Validating a child's struggles helps in a number of ways. It works to:

Build deep connection Relationships built at the time of vulnerability go deep and are hard to break.

Promote a child's wellbeing

Validation helps kids feel safe, which is what 'worry warts' and anxious kids want. Lack of understanding rather than fear itself often impacts negatively on a child's happiness.

Overcome disappointment and build resilience

Validation encourages kids to give voice to their concern or disappointment and either takes steps to rectify it or move on.

Develop emotional intelligence

Parental validation models emotional intelligence for children and teens. It requires you to identify the emotions that may be behind their language or behaviour.

Encourage empathy

Validation requires you to stop, listen and get on the same wavelength as your child.

Four steps to validating your child's emotions

Follow these steps when your child comes to you with their worries or concerns to make sure they feel understood.

Attend

Stop what you are doing and give your child full attention.

Observe

Listen with your eyes as well as your ears.

Reflect back their worries

Get down to their eye level if necessary, saying something like, "I see you're really concerned about this."

Touch

If appropriate, gently touch their shoulder or give them a hug when you speak to them. This will help them feel safe and comforted.

There's no better feeling for a child or teen who is struggling than knowing someone they value truly understands them.




GOSDEI Jn 21:1-14


Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land. As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

Jesus asked his disciples to let down their nets and they were rewarded. What are some things that Jesus asks us to do? How are we rewarded?
