Sacraments 2021

As you are aware the Sacramental Program which involves the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation were greatly impacted by the COVID-19 restrictions last year. Those students mostly affected are our current Year 5 students who could not receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist last year and our current Year 4 students who did not receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation last year.

Kriss Oliver, RE/Learning and Teaching Leader, Christine Carabott, Deputy Principal and myself have met with Father Peter to work together to organise the Sacraments for 2021 according to the most current COVID-19 guidelines for both the school and the Church. As you know these guidelines can change at any time depending on what is occurring in the community. The safety of all in our community must always come first and this is what our plan is based on. I am giving you the dates and times as early as I can so that those who wish to attend can arrange for that to happen. We have limited the attendance to 2 adults in order to follow the COVID-19 Safe Guidelines that are currently in place.

For Year 5 students receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist in 2021

The Year 5 students will receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist on Friday the 19th of March in Our Lady's Church. The students will be required to come to school later than usual at 12.00pm. We are able at this stage to have 2 adults attend with each child. The children would come to school dressed to receive the Eucharist. The Mass will start at 12:30pm and finish by 1:30pm. The students who received the Eucharist will be able to go home with their parents and celebrate together.

The school will have a party for the children in the following week.

For Year 3 and 4 students receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation in 2021

The Year 3 students will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Wednesday the 28th of April and the Year 4 students will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Thursday the 29th of April. The services will be held at Our Lady's Church and each child will be able to have 2 adults present. The students will come to school at the normal time. We ask that the children do not wear their school uniform but come to school dressed for the occasion. You will need to be seated in the Church by 12:30pm in order to participate and witness your child receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. After the service you are welcome to take your child home to celebrate together or your child may remain at school.

The school will have a party for the children in the following week.

For Year 4 students receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist in 2021

The Year 4 students will receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist on Friday the 14th of May in Our Lady's Church. The students will be required to come to school later than usual at 12 .00pm, with their accompanying 2 adults. We are able at this stage to have 2 adults attend with each child. The children would need to come to school dressed to receive the Eucharist. The Mass will start at 12:30pm and finish by 1:30pm. The students who received the Eucharist will be able to go home with their parents or the two adults that attended and celebrate together. The school will have a party for the children in the following week.

For Year 6 students receiving the Sacrament of the Confirmation in 2021

The date for the Year 6 Confirmation is set by the Bishop's office. This year our year 6 students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Friday the 12th of November at 7.00pm. As I have said before this is subject to the COVID-19 guidelines at the time and therefore could change.

Parents of students in Sacramental classes will receive further information about the Sacraments in the coming weeks. We will let you know as soon as possible if any changes need to be made to this plan. Please email myself or your child's teacher if you have any queries.





In today's First Reading, Job describes the futility of life before Christ. His lament reminds us of the curse of toil and death placed upon Adam following his original sin (see Genesis 3:17-19). Men and women are like slaves seeking shade, unable to find rest. Their lives are like the wind that comes and goes. But, as we sing in today's Psalm, He who



created the stars promised to heal the broken-hearted and gather those lost in exile from Him (see Isaiah 11:12; 61:1). We see this promise fulfilled in today's Gospel.

Simon's mother-in-law is like Job's toiling, hopeless humanity. She is laid low by affliction but too weak to save herself. But as God promised to take His chosen people by the hand (see Isaiah 42:6), Jesus grasps her by the hand and helps her up. The word translated "help" is actually Greek for "raising up." The same verb is used when Jesus commands a dead girl to arise (see Mark 5:41-42). It's used again to describe His own resurrection (see Mark 14:28; 16:7). What Jesus has done for Simon's mother-in-law, He has done for all humanity - raised all of us who lay dead through our sins (see Ephesians 2:5). <a href="Notice all the words of totality and completeness in the Gospel. The whole town gathers; all the sick are brought to Him. He drives out demons in the whole of Galilee. Everyone is looking for Christ. We too have found Him. By our baptism, He healed and raised us to live in His presence (see Hosea 6:1-2). Like Simon's mother-in-law, there is only one way we can thank Him for the new life He has given us. We must rise to serve Him and His gospel. Our lives must be our thanksgiving, as Paul describes in today's Second Reading. We must tell everyone the good news, the purpose for which Jesus has come - that others, too, may have a share in this salvation.

Helping children make a bright start to school

Starting school is a major step in a child's educational journey. It is made easier when children are prepared for the transition.

Children's milestone events such as starting school always bring a mix of emotions for both children and parents, with excitement, anticipation and nervousness being the most common. If either you or your child is feeling anxious about the big event then the following tips will help ease the tension and ensure your child makes the best possible start to their school life:

1. Be positive about the year ahead

School starters generally take their cues from their parents so your attitude to school, your child's teacher and learning can set the scene for a positive year ahead. Be positive and confident that your child will fit in and succeed and you increase the likelihood that they will do so.

2. Tell them what to expect

One of the best ways to ease a child's anxiety is to provide information about what they can expect at school. Over the school holidays, reinforce what they have already learned about lining up, play areas, routines and other aspects of school they may have experienced during the transition program. In this way your child will be better prepared for what happens when real school starts.

3. Develop your child's independence skills

Children with age-appropriate self-sufficiency skills generally find starting school much easier than children who have always had everything done for them. In the months leading up to the start of school make sure your child knows: how to open and close their lunchbox; how to pack their bag or backpack; how to use the toilet independently; and how to pack away their belongings. Practise eating play lunch and school lunch with your child. Also help them develop the habit of packing up their toys, their dinner plates and their clothes. These simple habits soon become ingrained patterns that will help maximise your child's long-term success at school.



4. Explain what school expects from them

Let your child know that being at school requires some behaviours that may be very different from those required

at home. For instance, there will most likely be different rules and routines. They will probably have to work with many more children, they may have to put up their hand to get a teacher's attention and they may have to wait their turn to be heard. Help them understand that in a classroom they may not be able to do things when they want to – which can come as a shock to some children. These lessons about fitting in will help your child adapt quickly to their new surroundings.

5. Teach social etiquette

School requires children to make friends with other children and also to work and play alongside others. Take the time to explain and role-play the social etiquette that will help your child succeed socially. "Jeremy, when you want to play with others you need to say, 'Excuse me! Can I join in your game?'" Another way for children to learn social etiquette is through play dates, family gatherings and family mealtimes. Also insist that your child shows good manners including using 'please' and 'thank you', which will aid their continued social development.



6. Familiarise them with the school environment

The scale of the physical environment of a school can be daunting for young children so consider spending some time at school during the holidays so they become familiar with the playground and the buildings. Also make the journey to and from school a number of times prior to the start of school so that they are comfortable when they go on the first day.

7. Develop a goodbye routine

Despite the best start to the school year there will always be those days when a child just doesn't want to go to school. Tears and tantrums are common for many school starters. It helps in these less-than-pleasant situations if you have a goodbye routine that includes a smile, a kiss and/or hug and leaving without looking back. If saying goodbye in the morning continues to be a struggle, seek the advice and help of your child's teacher.



8. Don't forget to develop a hello routine too!

Once school has finished some children just want to relax without talking about school, while others may unload about the events of the day. Follow their lead but regardless of whether your child opens up or closes down make sure they have some downtime so they can relax and unwind. If your child always presents a tale of woe about school ("I hate school. I'm not going back"), be patient and remember that children can be faulty observers and don't always see things as they really are. Help them look for the positive or good parts of their day by asking questions such as "What did you enjoy about today?"

At times of transition it's worth remembering that some children adapt to change far quicker than others. Some children adapt easily to new routines and new surroundings, while others may take many weeks to feel comfortable with going to school. If the latter is the case for your child, then patience, consistency and exposure to affirming parent networks may be the best allies that you and your child can have.

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B


Gospel

Mk 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.
