Dear Parents,

I would like to share with you my speech that I gave on the 100 Year Mass Celebration on Thursday 17th of October. The students have been given a commemorative badge and a timeline which outlines the history of Our Lady's School from 1919 to 2019 as a keepsake of Our Lady's School 100 Year birthday celebration. We hope that you together with your child/children will enjoy reading about the people who helped to shape Our Lady's school throughout its 100 year history.

On behalf of the Our Lady's school community it is my great pleasure to thank our distinguished guests: Archbishop Peter Comensoli, Bishop Mark Edwards OMI, the Priests who have concelebrated this mass, the Sisters of St Joseph, Staff from Catholic Education-Western Region, Representatives of the City of Brimbank and Principals from Catholic Primary and Secondary schools for their presence here today.

I would also like to warmly thank all the past students, staff members, families and friends of Our Lady's school for taking the time to join us here in Our Lady's church to celebrate Our Lady's school's 100th birthday. For us who make up the current Our Lady's school community 2019, today is a day of celebration and joy, a day to pause, honour and reflect on the past and to embrace the present and future that awaits us with faith and hope.

The history of Our Lady's school dates back to 1919 when Father John Carney realised the urgent need for a Catholic school. He lost no time in proceeding with the work and the school was built at a cost of just over 366 pounds. His Grace Daniel Mannix, the Archbishop of Melbourne at the time opened the school on the 12th of October 1919. The school's beginnings were humble but the vision and dream for Our Lady's was always big: to provide a high quality Catholic education for the children of Sunshine. This dream continues today.

We have created a summary of the school's history in the form of a timeline, which we have given to each of you as a keepsake. We hope that you will enjoy reading through it and reflecting on the people and events which helped to shape our beloved school.

Over the decades, each generation of Parish Priests, principals, staff, families and parishioners continued to build onto the work done by the previous generation-always dedicated to providing nothing but the best learning opportunities and learning environment for the students who attended the school. Our school motto 'Ad maiorem Dei gloriam' or 'All for the Glory of God' sums up the inspiration and motivation that fuelled many religious and lay staff, students, families and parishioners to build a school community which truly reflected the Gospel values, inspired a life-long love of learning and a sense of social justice.

As you read over the timeline you will see that Our Lady's school has been truly blessed and truly loved over its 100 years. Many of you that are sitting here today have had the privilege of serving this school community. Many of you have dedicated years to educating the students, improving and innovating Our Lady's school in a physical sense and more importantly in a spiritual sense. Working tirelessly to build a Catholic school community where authentic relationships based on love provide the means for all students to flourish and grow.

I want to acknowledge the outstanding contribution that both religious and lay staff past and present have made to the lives of the many thousands of young people and their families, and the justifiable proud history that Our Lady's school has as a Catholic education provider in the community of Sunshine.

This is an achievement we should all be proud of. Father John Carney's dream that began in 1919 is a dream that has been continued by many and has never diminished but rather continued to shine brightly throughout the school's 100 years.

Our Lady's school community today is rich in its cultural and linguistic diversity, has a strong sense of its own Catholic identity, nurtured by its deep historical and spiritual connections with the Sisters of St joseph and the Oblates of Mary Immaculate. Firmly at its centre are the students for whom we strive each day to create a joyful school that delivers a quality education which inspires our students to live a Christian way of life.

We warmly invite you all to come and join us after the mass in the school hall for a light lunch and refreshments. After which, you will have the opportunity to tour the school, view the facilities and meet the current staff and students. We have filled the school hall with pictures of the past and present, which we have will help to triager memories and

As you enter the school hall, you will see a table with a visitor's book for you to sign and write a short comment about your connection to Our Lady's school. This will be a record of your participation at this very special Our Lady's school milestone birthday.

Dear Parent,

Just a reminder that next Friday 25th October, Our Lady's will be participating in the registered event 'A Day for Daniel' for the third time. It has been organised by the Daniel Morecombe Foundation to help promote and educate children about safety. On this day, students are encouraged to wear something RED, which could be a red tee-shirt or red socks.

Wellbeing: Child Safety

As a whole school approach, and as part of the wellbeing and child safety curriculum, the students will be immersed in exploring different emotions. This also involves consolidating the concept of respecting each other's personal space and emotions. Students in Years F-3 will be viewing a video exploring a student's reaction to a homework situation at home with a sibling. Follow-up from the video will involve students exploring other ways that the situation can be dealt with in relation to taking one's emotions and feelings into account. The Years 4-6 will be watching a video involving students playing football with a focus on emotions and behaviour and how one person's behaviour can affect themselves and those around them.

Kids who accept differences in others are setting themselves up for success in the world of diversity that they will enter.

Want your child to be successful way past the confines of the school gate?

Then you need to make sure your child is tolerant of individual differences and accepting of children and adults who look and act differently to them.

There's no doubt that success in today's world depends on the ability to understand, appreciate and work with others. The child who is open to differences is likely to have more opportunities in school, in business and in life in general.

Schools are diverse places

Walk into any school ground in Australia and you'll witness diversity firsthand. You're likely to see children from many different cultural, racial and family backgrounds. You'll also see kids with different needs and diverse ways of expressing themselves. Some kids will wear their hearts on their sleeves, while others will be taciturn and quiet. Tolerant kids are accepting of these differences. They make friends with children and young people who may look and act differently to them.

Intolerance breeds bullying

Intolerance, or prejudice, is at the heart of a great deal of the bullying that occurs among children and young people. Kids who look and act differently or who are more isolated often experience bullying for no apparent reason other than the fact that they are 'different'. Whole-hearted acceptance and even appreciation of differences is a preventative bullying measure that we can all support.

Tolerance starts at home

Kids learn attitudes such as tolerance from those around them. Children in primary school usually reflect the attitudes of their parents. While adolescents are strongly influenced by their peers, parental attitudes still have a significant impact on their attitudes to other people. In short, if you want your child to be accepting of differences – whether they are racial, cultural, behavioural or in sexual orientation – then make tolerance a family trait.

parenting *****ideas

Here's how:

- Help your child feel accepted, respected, and valued. When your child feels good about himself, he is more able to treat others respectfully.
- Model acceptance. Kids learn what they live so make sure you welcome differences in others, and be sensitive to cultural or racial stereotypes. It also helps on a practical level to discuss prejudice and stereotypes when they occur in the media.
- Challenge prejudice or narrow-minded views. Sometimes kids, knowingly or unknowingly, can say the cruelest things about others. As a parent respectfully remind your child or young person about the impact that a narrow view can have on his or her own behaviour as well as on those it may be directed towards. Intolerance of diversity is an attitude that parents should make a stand against.





• **Respect individual differences within your own family.** Your ability to accept your children's differing abilities, interests and styles will go a long way towards establishing an attitude of tolerance in the children themselves. By valuing the uniqueness of each member of your family you are teaching your kids to value the strengths in others, no matter how diverse.

Modern Australia is such a wonderful culturally-rich place. This diversity is part of its magic. One way to make sure our children fully appreciate this richness is to fully embrace tolerance in everything we do.
