School Review 2016 Reviewer Feedback

Last Thursday Christine Wakeling our school Reviewer came to present her School Review Report to both the staff and the Parent Advisory Board. Schools are reviewed every four years, with this review period being 2012-2016. The reviewer used an evidence-based inquiry approach to evaluate how we have progressed in all of the Five Spheres of Schooling over the last four years:

Education in Faith

Learning and Teaching
Student Wellbeing
Leadership and Management
Community.

It is evident from the reviewer's report that we have achieved much and that together we have positively improved in all of the Five Spheres of Schooling. I am very proud to report to you some of the reviewers findings as outlined in her report:

'The review period has been one of significant improvement at Our Lady's School as it has sustained a strategic focus on embedding a contemporary pedagogy that is characterised by a shared vision and personalised learning.'

'The review finds that a dynamic professional community, committed to work together to create an effective learning environment, is firmly in place.'

'The school has been successful in strengthening its Catholic identity. It is acknowledged as a very welcoming community of faith with a clear commitment to integrating faith and religious education through Faith-Life-Inquiry learning.'

'The wellbeing culture of the school has been strengthened by the implementation of while school approaches to social and emotional learning, consistency in behaviour management and the adoption of a multi-faceted tiered approach to meeting the diversity of students' needs.

'The transformation of the school's approach to learning and teaching has been underpinned by a clear set of Curriculum Design principles, developed collaboratively'.

The review is a tool to measure school improvement and to then also set key challenges to ensure that the school will continue to improve. In collaboration with the reviewer, the review panel identified the following key challenges that the school is well placed to address in the next phase of school improvement and which include:

- Developing a shared understanding of Catholic contemporary and personalised learning and ensuring its alignment with teacher practice across the curriculum;
- Deepening understanding of assessment processes so that they provide a balance of formative and summative assessment;
- Ensuring a strategic and phased approach to both the implicit and explicit teaching and learning of the core competencies of appropriate social and emotional development F-6;
- Clarifying the role of feedback in the learning process, considering its timing, mode, amount and audience and the inclusion of student, staff and parent voice;
- Improving clarity around individual and team roles, responsibilities and performance expectations;

 Identifying the most effective ways to deepen connections between learning at home and at school, whilst empowering staff and parents in their roles as co-educators.

The staff of Our Lady's School and I look forward to collaborating with you the families to continue our journey of school improvement and to provide a learning environment where all children flourish.





Gospe Lk 12:13-21

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having had a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to

store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do; I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'
