Our Lady's School-A Child Safe School

The care, safety and wellbeing of all students at Our Lady's school is fundamental to all we do. You may have read about the new Child Safety Standards that all organisations working with children and young people are required to put into action in order to comply with new Victorian Government legislation.

I would like to reaffirm to you our parents and families our commitment to Child Safety and that all children attending Our Lady's school have the right to feel safe. The school affirms its commitment to child safety by adopting a 'zero tolerance' to child abuse in any shape or form. We are in the process of actively auditing and implementing and managing new strategies to address all the seven Child Safety Standards as outlined below:



At the very heart of each Catholic School is a desire for the full flourishing of each student...

Standard 1

Strategies to embed an organisational culture of child safety, including through effective leadership arrangements Standard 2

A child safe policy or statement of commitment to child safety Standard 3

A code of conduct that establishes clear expectations for appropriate behaviour with children

Standard 4

Screening, supervision, training and other human resources practices that reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing personnel

Standard 5

Processes for responding to and reporting suspected child abuse

Standard 6

Strategies to identify and reduce or remove risks of child abuse

Standard 7

Strategies to promote the participation and empowerment of children
