

# REPORTS CELEBRATING OUR STUDENTS ACHIEVEMENTS AND LEARNING FOR 2021

Please take the time to sit and read them with your child. Praise your child for all they have accomplished over this last Semester. Spend time discussing what have been the highlights and the challenges of this year. Most importantly celebrate their learning journey and their achievements.

I would like to reassure you that we are continuing to implement our COVID Safe plan in line with directions from authorities. We have also continued to learn from each positive case about how to minimise risk factors.

The current protocol for identifying a primary close contact is being in the same room for a total of 2 hours or more over the 48 hour period before symptoms appear. Given this definition, we are aware that it is imperative that we keep the students only with their own class and not mixing with other students while indoors. We are continuing to have staggered breaks so that there are less students in the playground at the same time and the students can only play with students in their own year level. Thank you to all parents who are making sure their child comes to school with a face mask as this makes a difference in minimising the risk of spreading the virus.

We ask all families to please:

**Keep your child at home if they have any symptoms.** Please be aware that a number of children have presented with hayfever symptoms but have tested positive for COVID. Get your child PCR tested at a testing site if they have any symptoms

Notify the school as soon as possible if your child receives a positive test result

May we remember all that this time should be as we wait in joyful hope. Amen



#### STEAM RAIL EXCURSION UPDATE

Unfortunately, due to the increase in COVID cases at our school we have had to make the difficult decision to cancel the whole school excursion on the Steam train which was organised for Friday the 10th of December. When we planned this event there were no COVID cases in the school, as you know this has not been the case over the last 2 weeks. We have had 4 cases so far in our school and although this is a significantly less number than many other schools in our area we want to do everything possible to minimise the spread. We hope that we can have this excursion next year.

#### **YEAR 6 GRADUATION NEWS UPDATE**

The Year Six students will celebrate their Graduation on Thursday 9th December. We ask that they come to school in smart casual clothes as they will not be required to wear their uniform on their graduation day. It will be wonderful to be able to celebrate this important milestone in your child's life.



The Graduation Mass will take place in the church from 2:15pm to 3:15pm. Parents are welcome to attend. If you are attending the Graduation Mass you will need to enter via the Church via the Monash street entrance and not via the school.


When you enter the church you will be required to sign in with the QR code and show your vaccination certificate. In the church you will be required to maintain social distance and to wear a mask. The Mass and ceremony will be recorded and the link will be posted on Seesaw so that you will be able to view it at your own leisure as well as show it to family and friends.

At the conclusion of the Mass and Graduation Ceremony, the students will be presented with their Graduation certificates and a small keepsake. Photos will be taken by the school throughout the ceremony and you will have access to these.

Once the Mass has ended parents will be asked to leave via the church exit and the students will return to school where they will be given a drink and a sweet and savoury snack. At 3:30pm the school disco will begin for the students to enjoy, and this will conclude at 4:30pm.

We ask parents to please come to the school's main gate (nearest the Office on Station Place) at 4:30pm to pick up their child. No student will be allowed to walk home by themselves.





# Building deep relationships with kids

Building a strong relationship with their children is every parent's dream. Here are some time-honoured ways of doing this if you can stick to them.

Every parent I know wants a great relationship with their children.

An effective way of promoting such relationships is through rituals and traditions. Rituals and traditions build close families.

For example, most strong families I know are underpinned by a strong food culture. In these families, every kid, no matter what their age, is expected to come to the meal table. Kids in these families are generally also expected to participate in other rituals and traditions.

This can require some parenting spine, but these rituals build wide relationships – that is, they gather the tribe together creating a wide relationship circle.

Individual parent-child relationships need to go deep. Deep relationships provide leverage. They also survive the potential storms of adolescence, during which relationships can become stormy and intense.

Certainly some ages are more amenable to positive relationship building than others. Developmentally, it's easiest to build deep relationships in the opportunity years of latency: five through to ten years of age.

The easiest way to build a deep relationship between yourself and each of your kids is to spend regular oneon-one time together.

- Go somewhere for a whole day with a child.
- Go away for a weekend with just one child. Do things you enjoy.
- If possible, go camping.
- Talk, Cook, Mooch.

These shared experiences can have a magic impact on relationships. They can sometimes lead to vast improvements in children's behaviour.

Another way to build deep relationships is to share an interest with a child. Having something in common, whether it's a shared love of sport, books or a hobby, creates an individual bond that goes deep. A shared interest also creates 'natural' opportunities for one-on-one time.

#### Make it happen

- One-on-one time needs to be organised.
- It generally won't happen by accident.
- It takes time. It takes energy. It takes a support mechanism to make it happen. Most of all takes permission.
- But one-on-one time is so worth the effort.
- One-on-one time is the coat hook upon which each of your children will hang their memories of you.
