

LUCIE


In iTime this term I researched the basic words of the Greek language.

Update on Curriculum Renewal

This week the staff spent the whole of Tuesday engaged in the auditing and redesigning of the Our Lady's school curriculum to align it with the new *Victorian Curriculum Framework* and the Catholic Education Melbourne Curriculum Framework the *Horizons of Hope*.

Curriculum renewal is an important step to ensure that we continue to give our students the skills they need for work and life: literacy, numeracy, scientific knowledge and skills, resilience, respectful relationships, the use of digital technologies and the capacity for critical and creative thinking and expression. Supporting our teachers in implementing curriculum change is essential to improving the learning outcomes of our students. The quote below describes the meaning of curriculum within a Catholic context.


Curriculum in a Catholic school is illuminated by the Catholic faith with the formation of and reverence for the learner at its centre.

Learning experiences are designed to help learners develop their knowledge, skills and understanding in all learning areas. It is within this context that all learners are entitled to access a quality curriculum, where they have a feeling of connectedness and belonging, of being known and valued, and listened to.

A New Vision for our Garden

Last year we began the improvement to the garden area around the school hall and I am very happy to say that we are now extending that new look garden to the front and side of the office area and in front of the art room. The entrance to a school is very important and our garden was looking a little tired as well as that it needed continual maintenance to keep the plants in shape and stop them from becoming overgrown. Below you will see the design of the new garden which will include standard roses and carpet roses in the front section around the statue of Mary, low ground coverings which will grow into soft mounds of flowers which are white and purple in colour. There will be feature trees planted along the back of the office and the side. One of the most exciting aspects to this new garden project has been a collaborative idea which was originally suggested to me by Abbey (5D) 2 years ago, who wanted to create an area in our school with a 'Buddy' seat so that children can go to the seat knowing that they will find a buddy to sit with them. Abbey was inspired by the life of her uncle's friend Cameron Stewart Baird VC who was awarded the Victoria Cross medal for bravery, and for sacrificing his own life for his mates, while serving in Afghanistan. He was the ultimate example of being a good 'Buddy'. This garden should be completed during the school holidays. Abbey and the school captains both helped in the design of this garden. I hope like myself, the school captains and Abbey, that you can't wait to see it!

A variety of arts, crafts, board games, construction, recreational activities, sensory and imaginary play opportunities are available every day for children to choose. Homework & Home Readers Time – Our YMCA staff are there to encourage home readers and homework and most days we set aside a time to encourage this!

If you or someone else is picking up your child (children) early from school and they are not attending the after school care, please let OSHC Team know. Please remember children need to bring their school hat (Broadbrim or Legionaries Hat) from 1st September to 1st May and sunscreen will need to be applied when playing outside.

Bookings and Cancellations: It is important to book your child's place so we can plan and expect their arrival at Before and After School Care. Our Lady's OSHC would like to offer families the opportunity to enrol children into a full day of care on Thursday 29 June 2017, day of Learning Conversations.

For existing families, if you would like your child to attend, please enrol your child by seeing our OSHC Team in the OSHC Room and complete your details on the sign-up sheet or go online by **Wednesday 21st June 2017**.

Gospel

Jn 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said Jesus replied:
