IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Safety Procedures

- In order to ensure that all our safety procedures are in place we ask all parents to sign in at the front office. This includes if you are here as a parent helper, a member of the Parents and Friends, or volunteering in any capacity at the school.
- Parents who drop their children off in the morning and then stay at school for a special event are still required to come to the office to sign-in. At all times we need to know who is on the school premises.
- Once you have signed in you must wear your visitors badge and WWCC at all times while in the school until you sign out and hand it back to the office staff.

Bookings will not be accepted on the day unless places, adequate staffing and resources are available.

Additional permissions are required if your child is attending an excursion.

Cancellations must be in writing and received seven (7) days before the last day of school term. Updates made to your online booking are considered to be 'in writing'.

A late fee of \$2 per minute applies when a child is picked up after 6.00pm.

Gospel Lk 15:1-10

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them:

'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance.

'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'
